Session 5: Day 7 - The Sabbath

So the heavens and the earth and everything in them were completed. By the seventh day God completed His work that He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work that He had done. God blessed the seventh day and declared it holy, for on it He rested from His work of creation. - Genesis 2:1-3

- 3x text states that God did not work on the 7th Day
- Genesis 2:1 (7 Hebrew words)
- Genesis 2:2 (7 Hebrew words)
- Genesis 2:3 (7 Hebrew words)
- No "evening and then morning" suggests day is eternal

Sabbath - "cease/rest"

God - An example for man
Israel - Original day of rest, not worship. For land.
Man - Trust in sovereignty of God
Eternity - Points to an eternal rest
